This European legislation will impact on all exporters into the EU. Exporters from Australia need to be aware of requirements that will be imposed upon them by European importers and consumers.



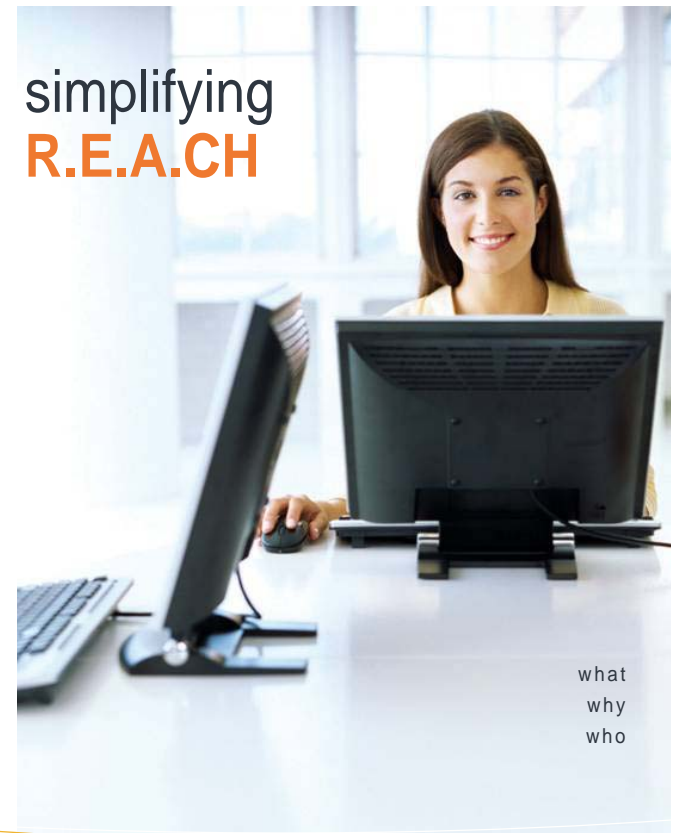

Tea Tree Oil and other Essential oils will be affected by the REACH legislation which requires pre-registration of all chemicals consumed in the EU in excess of 100 tonnes per annum.

- Pre-registration must occur in 2008.
- No chemical is excluded from REACH compliance.
- Australians need to liaise with their European counterparts

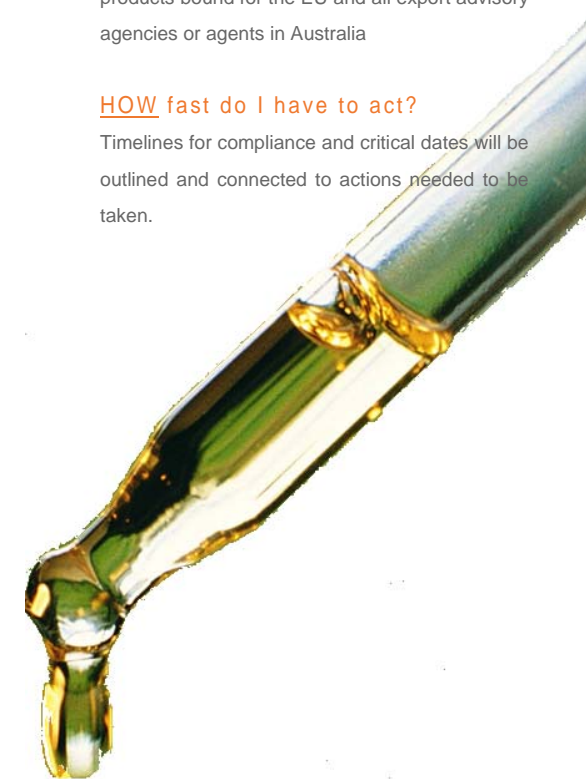
